

Research Tips and Tricks: Constructing an Essay

An essay outline is a basis of writing an essay. Every [essay writer](#) prior to writing an essay chalks out a sketch of the essay that makes them understand the theme. The outline describes the arrangement of ideas in paragraphs. An outline must follow a format to fulfill the requirements of writing an essay as mostly teachers ask for an outline only before actual submission. An essay outline is a summary of ideas in bullet points along with headings.



The following is guidance on how to make an outline in no time. I used to think that it is tedious to make an outline when I am supposed to [write my essay for me](#) anyways. However, with practice and a little effort, one can compose an essay outline easily. I will discuss step by step process of how to formulate an outline in the following section.

1. Make three main headings with titled roman numbers. These three main headings include introduction, body, and conclusion. Write all these three headings as follows.
 2. Introduction
 3. Body
- III. Conclusion

1. These are the main level one heading of the outline. After this, start with the research and find 10 sources. Once you are done with the research, scrutinize the sources to the best 7. Now using those sources make topic sentences in the body section.
2. The body section should have at least five paragraphs. Such that four paragraphs support your stance on the topic, and the fifth paragraph is the other argument that states the other party's stance. You should share evidence for it and provide evidence that supports your idea to impose your stance effectively.
3. Make the topic sentences using this evidence and under the body section, state the topic sentences with titled letters. After the topic sentence, which is the opening of any paragraph. The outline should have premise stated, then evidence, and lastly summing up the paragraph idea.

Thus, the body paragraph can be as:

1. Body
2. Topic sentence
3. Premise
4. Evidence

iii. Summary of paragraph

1. Five paragraphs should be made like the above format in the body section. As for the introduction section, the statements should include the opening statement, definition, background, and thesis statement.
2. Similarly, for the conclusion, you can use the thesis statement at the start, then a summary of all body paragraphs, and at the end, a conclusive statement.

Apart from the structuring and organizing format. There are other tips for [essay writer](#) to concern as well to improve the quality of an outline. These few tips are as follows.

1. Know your topic well and do thorough research on each aspect. It will help to opt for a side that you are going to support. You should consider all the aspects to make your research and arguments credible.
2. Structure and organize the essay in a specific order to make sure that your essay is readable and coherent.
3. Make sure that you use proper vocabulary and an official tone. An outline does not mean that your tone can be informal. You should use an academic tone in all the points. For evidence, it must contain stats that you will add. In the case of an outline, [essay writer online](#) can use quoted evidence. But in an essay, it must be paraphrased.
4. The premise and topic sentence should be proper, such that when you write an essay, you only need to combine sentences.
5. Do not make long sentences just a basic idea is enough. However, make sure that the sentences are not choppy, and your aim reaches the reader through it.

Following is a pattern of outline that should be followed by every writer.

1. Introduction
2. Opening sentence
3. Definition
4. Background
5. Thesis statement
6. Body
7. Topic sentence/ claim (argument)
8. Premise
9. Evidence
